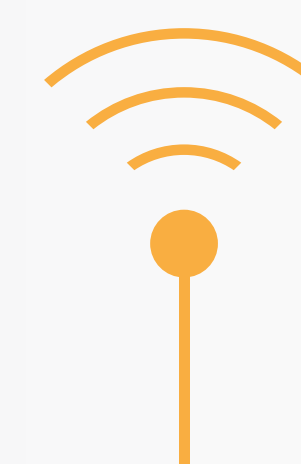

HOW TO ACCESS LOCAL CHANNELS



Make sure you have the right antenna

To pick up the major networks (ABC, CBS, FOX, and NBC), along with select other channels (PBS, CW, etc.), you'll need a good HD antenna which will cost less than \$40.

Pick up of major networks vary and may not be available in all areas, as HD antenna use is largely dependent upon your location.
